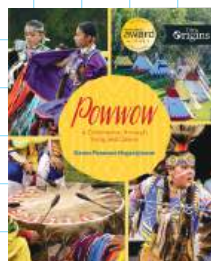
Watch and Jot

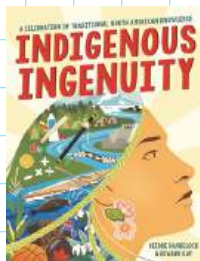

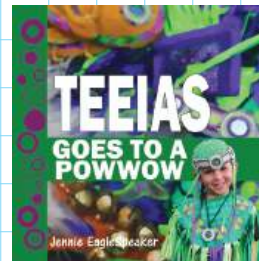
